# CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS AND POLICYMAKERS TO KNOW

## House Committee on Energy and Commerce Chairman Greg Walden (R-OR)

This committee is vested with the broadest jurisdiction of any congressional authorizing committee. Today it has responsibility for the nation's telecommunications, consumer protection, food and drug safety, public health research, environmental quality, energy policy, and interstate and foreign commerce. It oversees multiple cabinet-level departments and independent agencies, including the Departments of Energy, Health and Human Services, Commerce, and Transportation, as well as the Environmental Protection Agency, the Federal Trade Commission, the Food and Drug Administration and the Federal Communications Commission. ## Senate Committee on Environment & Public Works Chairman John Barrasso (R-WY)

This committee has jurisdiction on issues related to environmental policy, water, air and noise pollution, flood control, nuclear energy, waste disposal and recycling, and matters relating to environmental protection, resource utilization and conservation. The committee also has jurisdiction of federal agencies including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Energy and Department of Transportation. ## House Committee on Financial Services Chairman Jeb Hensarling (R-TX)

This committee has jurisdiction on issues pertaining to the economy, the banking system, housing, insurance, and securities and exchanges. Additionally, the committee also has jurisdiction over monetary policy, international finance, international monetary organizations, and efforts to combat terrorist financing. ## **Senate Committee on Banking, Housing & Urban Affairs** Chairman Michael Crapo (R-ID)

This committee plays an integral role in managing legislation that affects the lives of many Americans. Primarily known for having a long-standing history of writing and passing legislation focusing on our nation's banks. These areas of jurisdiction include, but are not limited to: banking, insurance, financial markets, securities, housing, urban development and mass transit, international trade and finance, and economic policy. ## **House Committee on Ways and Means** Chairman Kevin Brady (R-TX)

This committee is the oldest committee in Congress, and is the chief tax-writing committee in the House of Representatives. Since 1865, this committee has continued to exercise jurisdiction over revenue and related issues such as tariffs, reciprocal trade agreements and the bonded debt of the United States. Revenue-related aspects of the Social Security system, Medicare, and social services programs have come within Ways and Means' purview in the 20th century. This committee is responsible for matters relating to taxation, reciprocal trade agreements, tariff and import quotas and other revenue measures, as well as health programs under the Social Security Act including Medicare, Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families.
